

Fontwell Park 15th June Racing Preview

1st race– The Angel Arabian Maiden Stakes 3yrs old + over 1 Mile 2 Furlongs

A massive field of 21 maidens have entered this contest and it is slightly to be a highly competitive race. The selection is the beautifully bred Al Sakbe son **Marsak** from the all conquering Duffield yard, his dam is a full sister to Dormane, and he is obviously highly rated by connections who have entered him in the Derby. His main dangers come from Al Bashiq who was a good 3rd to Ejaabi over this trip at Huntingdon and merits respect, as does Maakar who was a good staying on 4th to Edjalie on her debut over 6f at Huntingdon and this step up in trip should suit.

2nd race – The Powells of Coolham Handicap Stakes 0-70 over 7 Furlongs

Pavots Dreamboy looked to be labouring over 14f at Huntingdon when well beaten by Estival, but this is much more his trip and that race will have put him spot on and he should add to his tally here. Remaal is on a nice mark for a well bred filly and looked to be getting the hang of things with a running on 3rd to Edjalie over 6f at Huntingdon and will appreciate the extra furlong, whilst Muhal ran well when 2nd to Operatic and can snatch a place here.

3rd race –The Vectis Insurance Services Handicap Stakes over 1 Mile 6 Furlongs

Kepassa has really matured over the winter and has won both his races very impressively this term at Taunton over 10f and at Huntingdon where he beat listed winner Aljaareh; he can add to his haul here, whilst Aljaareh is a very decent stayer and is more than capable of reversing the form. Malik D'Or is a Group winner over this 12f and will get every yard of this trip and has place claims. Tabeer, last year's winner of this race, could also turn out to go for back to back successes.

4th race – The Royal Cavalry of Oman Handicap Stakes 0-95 over 7 Furlongs

An excellent race with raiders from Oman and also Qatar with Georgina Ward bringing over her team for Al Shahania Farm. The selection has to be the wonderful Amer daughter **Magadir** who looked so impressive when slamming Wall Street 5 lengths in the Qatar Derby; she should have the class to win this and is entered in the UK Derby. Her main dangers are Angel Picamer who is continuing to improve and won a competitive handicap over 6f at Wolverhampton last week and won a listed race over 8f at Newbury on Dubai Day last year. Whilst Zoumir won the UAE Derby and is entered in the UK equivalent and merits plenty of respect.

5th race – The Harwood Arabian Stud Handicap 0-85 over 1 Mile 4 Furlongs

Ejaabi looked pretty impressive when out-pointing Barik to win his maiden on his debut at Huntingdon over 10f; he is entered in the Derby and should have the class to win this. Quorman Des Vialettes was firmly put in his place by Estival when 2nd to her over 14f at Huntingdon; this drop in trip might suit and he also holds a Derby entry so is clearly well regarded. Whilst Deolali was a good 2nd to Kepassa at Taunton over 10f and his last run is best forgotten; he'll stay every yard of this trip and if back to his best should be in the shake up.

6th race – The Jebel Ali Racing Club Handicap 0-50 over 1 Mile 4 Furlongs

Serabitibi ran well when chasing home The Way To Go over 13f when beaten less than a length into 3rd at Taunton, she romped home at Wolverhampton over 6f furlongs and is definitely on the upgrade and can take this race for a quick double. Dibba has been outclassed in maidens but is well bred and could well outstay the field in this her handicap debut. Whilst Anganate Safinat was 2nd to The Way To Go at Taunton and can never be discounted over this trip at this level.

7th race – The Hope Farm Trading Race OPEN (TBs and AAs) over 1 Mile 2 Furlongs

Take The Plunge won well at Taunton over 8f beating Global Achiever 6 lengths, and can win again here to land a double. Infidel impressed at Huntingdon when chasing home Night Cap over 10f and it wouldn't be a surprise to see him go one better here, whilst Golden Peacock has been running well in defeat this season twice chasing home Megabond over 6f and 7f, looks capable of being in the thick of it here.

8th race – The Anglo Arabian Stakes over 1 Mile 4 Furlongs

Madrison looked very impressive when scooting home at Warwick last season over 10f to land the Anglo championship with the smart L'Escalou and Curupanna chasing him home; he ran well on his

debut when 4th to Night Cap over 10f and can win here. Curupanna was making hay in Anglo races last term winning 4 decent races, she can chase home Madrison here.
