Race 1 – Maiden over 1 Mile 2 Furlongs:

The impeccably bred Paul De Faust can open his account for Champion trainer Gill Duffield here. His main dangers come from Sam Davison's Debrett who will be sharper for his run at Wolverhampton and Bill Smiths nicely bred colt Jaxy King.

Race 2 – OPEN (TBs, AA & PBAs) over 10 f:

The unbeaten Night Cap from John Wilson's yard is likely to extend his run over track and trip sure to suit, his main dangers come from the ever consistent La Perruche and Fraternity who was just touched off at Wolverhampton last time.

Race 3 – Handicap 0-75 over 7 Furlongs:

Benamer looked impressive when winning on his debut over this trip at Wolverhampton, he can continue his winning run. Al Mamoon goes well fresh and is a big danger, as is WA Savannah Sunrise who is as tough as teak and will be there at the end.

Race 4- Conditions 1 Mile 2 Furlongs:

Multiple Group winner Malik D'Or can avenge his defeat at Wolverhampton by winning this race, he is the class act in the field and the one they all have to beat. Madid won his only start last year and is a big danger, whilst CS Malik won nicely at Newbury over this trip and has place claims.

Race 5 – Handicap 0-65 over 7 Furlongs:

SA Bibi is as game as they come and always wins at least once in a season and is rarely out of the money, this track and trip looks ideal and he can make his 6 lb pull with top weight count. Eternal bridesmaid Nenette will be fighting out the finish and Notid can never be discounted even under top weight.

Race 6 – Handicap 0-90 over 1 Mile 5 Furlongs:

Aljaareh ran well over this trip when 4th on Dubai Day on only his third race, this track and trip look sure as he is half brother to leading stayer Taabeer, he can open his account for the season. CS Khan will love the trip and runs well fresh and has strong place claims, whilst Fedor Du Bournais could cause an upset if on a going day.

Race 7 – Handicap 0-50 over 1 Mile 5 Furlongs:

Kizhi looked on the upgrade when winning last season over this trip at Huntingdon and can score again here. Her main danger is from El Chenz who improved with every race last season notching two good place efforts in September, whilst Bonham ran encouragingly at Wolverhampton and has place claims.
