

**Arabian Racing:**

**1<sup>st</sup> race – Arabs Maiden over 7 f:**

Benamer is a racing debutante and beautifully bred; he should open his account. Carazan and Gazal are from leading trainers and should make their presence felt.

**2<sup>nd</sup> race – TB/AA & PBA over 1 m 4 f:**

An interesting race with the Part Bred Arabs taking on the Thoroughbreds. Emma Owen's string made hay in these events last year and Final Lap should open his "Arab" account. La Perruche won and was placed in the Open Race series last year and goes particularly well for owner/trainer/jockey Philip Rondel.

**3<sup>rd</sup> race – Arabs Handicap 0-75 over 6 f:**

Earlson looked progressive last year when winning his final start at Warwick and can take this, whilst Rampart and Operatic are tough and speedy and will make the selection pull out all the stops.

**4<sup>th</sup> race – Arabs 1 Mile Conditions:**

Malik D'Or can confirm his superiority over No Risk Al Maury, who he beat impressively at Warwick in a Group 2 event in October. Sabden is unexposed and could cause an upset.

**5<sup>th</sup> race – Arabs Handicap 0-45 over 6 f:**

Benny The Dip can win this and start the season as he means to go on, a course winner over 5 furlongs, this extra distance won't inconvenience him. Nahr and Glastonbury Pop pose his biggest threats.

**6<sup>th</sup> race – Arabs Maiden over 1 Mile 1 f:**

Hathrah went down narrowly to Sabden over this trip last season at Stratford, however, she can make her experience count against this field and should lose her maiden tag in style. Sharka is extremely well bred and hails from a top yard and will exploit any weakness in the selection, whilst Estival comes from a yard that knows the score and should be thereabouts.

**7<sup>th</sup> race – Arabs Handicap 0-60 over 1 Mile 4 f:**

Raihan is a course specialist who had last year off; connections are sure to have her well prepared and she should take all the beating. Mehshiv is tough and consistent and also a track winner and will be there at the end, as should SA Bibi who is tough as teak.

**8<sup>th</sup> race – Arabs Handicap 0-90 over 1 Mile:**

Albaab won her only start here last season over 7f and hails from the champion trainer's yard, so will be hard to beat. Deolali is consistent and versatile and will make her pull out all the stops.
